Claude Monet (1840-1926) Monet was the leading figure of the impressionist group As a teenager in Normandy he was brought to paint outdoors by the talented painter Eugène Boudin Boudin taught him how to use oil paints Monet was constantly in financial difficulty His paintings were rejected

by the Salon and critics attacked his work

Monet: The Early Years will be the first major US exhibition devoted to the initial phase of Claude Monet's (French, 1840-1926) career and the way the colors of an object changed at different times of the day Monet particularly liked to paint the They should color with crayons and add watercolor paints to finish the work Grades K

Around 1890 Monet began his fascination with painting series which continued for the rest of his career He would observe and paint a subject under various light and atmospheric conditions at different times of day or season Bridge Over a Pool of Water Lilies is part of a series of 18 views of the Japanese footbridge in his garden at Giverny
